## Full-block letter format – p. 146

All the elements are left aligned

### Block letter format – p. 147

- All the elements are left aligned **EXCEPT**:
- 1) the date and
- 2) the complimentary close, signature, name and title line.

### Official letter format – p. 148

- This format is used by some government agencies.
- The inside address appears two to five lines below the signature block.

## Simplified letter format – p. 149

All the elements are left aligned BUT:

- subject line used instead of salutation
- no complimentary close
- name and title written in capital letters

# Modified block (semi-block) letter format – p. 150

The same as block format EXCEPT


