MOTIVATION LETTER SHOULD BE:

- Short and precise
- Maximum 1 page
- Formal

- Unique
- Effective

STRUCTURE OF THE MOTIVATION LETTER

Opening paragraph:

State who you are and why you are writing.

Middle paragraphs (1-2):

Highlight the relevant information and explain your motivation for applying for the exchange program.

Closing paragraph:

Thank the reader for his/her consideration and indicate that you are looking forward to hearing from him/her.

MOTIVATION LETTER – TIPS FOR WRITING

- Avoid errors pay attention to your written language style, grammatical errors, spelling mistakes...
- Show, don't tell!
- "I am a good leader." vs. ""I led a group of my fellow students on a week-long climbing expedition, where we successfully..."
- Do your research!
- Be specific!
- Be interesting!
