
Unit 2: The history and the present of business



BUSINESS – countable or uncountable?

• **business** (unc.) => more general meaning: the activity of making, buying, selling, or supplying goods or services for money

> e.g. We do **business** with foreign partners. Business or pleasure? (NOT a business / businesses)

 business (c.) => more specific meaning an organization (such as a store or company) that makes, buys, or sells goods or provides services in exchange for money.

e.g. She has **a business** of designing clothes for dogs. He runs several **businesses.**



Economy vs Economics

production, trade and the supply of money in a particular country or region" (pl. economies)

Economics

is a science that studies economies and develops possible models for their functioning.

- e.g. *He studied* <u>**economics**</u> *at the LSE (London School of Economics).*
- The <u>economy</u> is in recession.

economic vs economical (adj.)

- <u>economic</u> : connected with economy
- <u>economical</u>: carries a somewhat figurative meaning of "not requiring too much of something" (such as money, space, time, etc.)
 - The <u>economic</u> growth is very slow.
 In this small apartment we have a very economical use of space.
